




#### LEVEL 1: LIMBO


My thesis is based on a Science Museum which narrates the known and unknown theories and mysteries of the 3 dimensions or planes of existence of our universe-space, land and water.The 4th dimension is a dimensional or spatial fabric that connects all the 3 dimensions together.It is the transition space or portal connecting one part of the museum to another.The Museum narrates the story of evolution of life; from nothing to everything. Hence it covers all the events in a sequential manner from the big bang till the civilization of species. It is divided in 3 belts of formation, creation and civilization. Each belt has a dual gallery or space, exposing its known or unknown nature of any particular story/event/fact. Hence there are gallery or spaces of known facts or unknown facts. The museum is unidirectional in its circulation, thereby eliminating chances of confusion and disconnection in the story. The entire project is like a science fiction story book where the journey tends to create emotions like excitement, thrill, fear, confusion, rejoice, peace, mystic and so on. Study of space and architecture psychology and how it affects the emotion and mood of a person's psychological state has been implemented while designing the building's interior, exterior and landscape. Utopian and Dystopian style of architecture along with the design principle of Mystery architecture has been implemented in designing and defining the known and unknown dimensions of the museum. The main aim of this museum is to make architecture narrate its story of evolution through its spaces, so that one can feel the spaces and understand its emotion while travelling the journey




#### **LEVEL 8: FRAUD - HYPOCRITES**

Dante's interpretation: Forced to march wearing heavy robed resembling a monks cowl lined with lead, symbolically representing hypocrisy.

Architectural interpretation: penitents in this level are to climb a ramp with varying height of the ceiling forcing them to bend through the space, the floor is embedded with shards of mirror so they get a glimpse themselves as they walk through.





#### LEVEL 8: FRAUD - FLATTERERS

Dante's interpretation: immersed in a river of human excrement representing their words

Architectural interpretation: In this level, the penitents are walking through a room, the floor of this room is embedded with a few sensors that once stepped on, release a box that is attached on the ceiling. The box then comes crashing down spilling its contents, algae and fungi that gives a sewage like odor which splashes over the person as they walk through.

There has been a noticeable revival of trends in urban India with respect to lifestyles- an increasing part of the population is starting to adopt practices and objects that were once popular, modified to suit contemporary needs. The usage of clay objects is one such exampleit is, albeit at a slow pace, gaining popularity various benefits eco-friendly, cost effective, healthier.

Design intervention when it comes to Pottery town, is in accordance with this shift in viewpoints. Being an important part of Bangalore's heritage, it is in dire need of this redevelopment as the century-old pottery industry in this settlement faces a decline. As is the case with every other aspect of lifestyles, architecture and design are also in need of this process of reviving, modifying and contemporizing.

The intent of this thesis is to redesign Pottery Town, an age-old settlement in Bangalore, in an attempt to resuscitate the pottery industry that once thrived here, and to re-establish the importance it holds in Bangalore's history and character, as a for traditional destination and contemporary pottery in the city.

This project includes studying Pottery Town, with respect to its history,traditions, context in addition to its social and spatial problems. An attempt has been made to solve these problems using design, with the aid of studies conducted on successful pottery(and other craft) establishments, and to create better suited spaces to accommodate these artisans and their craft, while retaining the character and old charm of the area. Based on the social, occupational and spatial problems faced by the residents of this establishment, the design includes pottery production spaces, exhibition and market spaces, low-cost housing for potters and their families, and spaces for demonstrations, classes, film screenings and talks.








National Tour was organised by BMSSA to North India on 16th Jan 2018. This helped the students to practically learn about the building details and construction technique of North India.
